Today we continue the great Easter celebrations begun last night at the Easter Vigil. They mark the start of fifty days of Eastertide. Fifty days of celebration after the forty days of Lent, rejoicing in the victory on the Cross of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who has opened the way to heaven and eternal life for us all.

Please do stay afterwards for our parish party as we celebrate.

Children & families

Children and families are very welcome here: our Sunday School meets at the back of Church and there is also a 'Children's Chapel' space with books and toys in the South Aisle, for young children and their parents to use at any point during Mass. Toilets are available at the back of church and in the crypt, accessed via the stairs at the end of the South Aisle.

During the Mass

'Talk to God before Mass, and each other afterwards!'

Please follow the directions to *sit*, *stand or kneel in italics* and join with the words in bold. Please remember that people are trying to pray before Mass, so keep silence as much as possible and don't disturb those at prayer.

Please also remember that the time after receiving Holy Communion is for quiet prayer and contemplation – <u>not to have conversations.</u>

Holy Communion

At the Giving of Holy Communion, if you are confirmed and wish to receive the Sacrament, please come forward to receive Communion via the main aisle following the directions of the sidesmen.

<u>Everyone</u> is very welcome to come forward for a blessing: if you would like one, please bow your head.

Holy Communion is offered at the communion rail in both forms. Please kneel, unless you are unable. The Host is received on the tongue, (or if preferred on the hands)

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Please stand when the bell rings for the entrance of the sanctuary party



The Greeting

In the name of the Father ★ and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

The Lord be with you.





Alleluia, Christ is risen!

All respond heartily: He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

The Priest introduces the Mass & the Sunday School come forward to receive their scriptures, blessing & items for their altar.

The Penitential Rite

He then invites us to prepare to confess to God with the Collect for purity:

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Priest invites us to consider and confess our sins:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

The Priest pronounces the absolution.

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, ♣ pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

This is the word of the Lord Thanks be to God

Psalm 118 R/O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good

2 Let Israel now proclaim, 'His mercy endures for ever.'

19 Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter and give thanks to the Lord.

21 I will give thanks to you, for you have answered me and have become my salvation.

<u>Please turn to face the Gospel</u>, proclaimed from the midst of the people

The Gospel of the Lord **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Homily – please sit.

The homily is followed by a time of silent reflection.

<u>Please stand</u> for the renewal of baptismal vows

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy catholic Church.

And so I ask you:

Do you renounce sin, so as to live in the freedom of the children of God? **I do.**

Do you renounce the lure of evil, so that sin may have no mastery over you?

I do.

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

I do.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

And may Almighty God, the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by His grace, in Christ Jesus Our Lord for eternal life .

Amen.

The priest sprinkles the people with Holy Water in a reminder of their baptism, as the choir sing the **Vidi Aquam**.

<u>Please remain standing</u> for The Intercessions

After each petition: Lord, in your mercy **Hear our prayer**.

As we pray for the dead: Rest eternal, grant unto them O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them.

After the final petition we entrust all our prayer and petitions to the unceasing prayers of the Saints in heaven, especially to the Blessed Virgin Mary who we greet saying:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

The Priest concludes the prayer, and all respond: Amen.

The Peace

The risen Christ came and stood among His disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia.

(John 20.19,20)

The peace of the Lord be always with you **And also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace *All share a sign of peace with those near them*

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

<u>Please sit</u> for the offertory hymn as bread and wine are brought forward by the people, for the preparation of the altar. During this hymn a collection is taken towards the costs of Christ Church's ministries – if you don't have cash, there is a contactless reader by the entrance.

<u>Please stand</u> when the congregation is censed by the thurifer.

Offertory Hymn

The Priest offers the Prayer over the Gifts, and all respond. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you And also with you

Lift up your hearts We lift them up to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

It is right to give Him thanks and praise

The Priest continues with the Opening (Preface) of the Prayer of Thanksgiving at the end of which the choir leads the **Sanctus**

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

<u>Please kneel</u> as the Priest continues the Prayer of Thanksgiving. He first invokes the Holy Spirit to sanctify the offerings of bread and wine. He then recalls the Lord's actions the night before he died. A bell is rung as the Priest elevates the consecrated Host and Chalice. He then says:

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Priest continues with the Eucharistic Prayer. At the end, all respond:



The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

As the Priest breaks the bread, he says:

We break this bread, to share in the Body of Christ Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

As the bread is broken, we sing the Agnus Dei:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Giving of Communion

<u>Please remaining kneeling</u> as the Priest shows the Body of Christ

Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof,
but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Before coming forward to receive Holy Communion, all pray together:
We do not presume to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table. But thou art the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy.

Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

As the Priest receives Holy Communion, a bell is rung & the people come forward. If you are confirmed, please come forward to receive Communion via the main aisle, following the directions of the stewards.

All are welcome to come forward for a blessing: if you would like one, please bow your head.

Holy Communion is offered in both forms at the Communion Rail. Please kneel, unless you are unable. The Host is received on the tongue (or, if preferred, on the hands.) If you don't wish to receive from the Chalice, you can return to your seat after receiving the Host.

Intinction (dipping the Host in the Chalice) is not permitted.

During the receiving of Holy Communion, the Choir sing an Anthem

Communion Hymn

There is a time of silent prayer.

Once the Sacred Vessels have been cleansed, <u>Please stand to</u> give thanks together with the **Prayer of Thanksgiving after Holy Communion**

We pray together:

Almighty God, we thank thee for feeding us with the body and blood of thy Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer thee our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of thy Spirit to live and work to thy praise and glory. Amen.

The priest sings the Prayer after Communion

Look upon your Church, O God, with unfailing love and favour, so that, renewed by the paschal mysteries, she may come to the glory of the resurrection. Through Christ our Lord.

Amen

Notices – *please sit.*

The Blessing of Easter Eggs - please stand

Baskets of Easter Eggs are brought forward to be blessed, which will be distributed by them after the Mass. We also bless Easter Eggs to be given to the children of the parish.

The Solemn Blessing and Dismissal - please remain standing

The Lord be with you. And also with you

The people are invited to bow down to receive the blessing.

May almighty God bless you through today's Easter Solemnity and, in his compassion, defend you from every assault of sin. **Amen.**

And may he, who restores you to eternal life in the Resurrection of his Only Begotten, endow you with the prize of immortality. **Amen.**

Now that the days of the Lord's Passion have drawn to a close, may you who celebrate the gladness of the Paschal Feast come with Christ's help, and exulting in spirit, to those feasts that are celebrated in eternal joy. **Amen.**

And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you for ever.

Go in the peace of Christ, alleluia, alleluia! Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia!

As the Sanctuary party departs, all sing the Recessional Hymn

Thine be the glory, risen, conquering Son, Endless is the victory thou o'er death hast won; Angels in bright raiment rolled the stone away, Kept the folded grave-clothes where thy body lay.

Thine be the glory, risen, conquering Son, Endless is the vict'ry thou o'er death hast won.

Lo, Jesus meets us, risen from the tomb;
Lovingly he greets us, scatters fear and gloom;
Let the Church with gladness hymns of triumph sing,
For her Lord now liveth, death hath lost its sting:
Thine be the glory, risen, conquering Son,
Endless is the vict'ry thou o'er death hast won.


