Whoever you are and wherever you are from, know you are very welcome to join us for our worship this morning as we celebrate the great Solemnity of Christ the King.

Our celebrations continue with a Taizé service at 6pm this evening, please do join us.

The Blessed Sacrament is exposed for Adoration on the Altar from 10am, during which time we also offer Morning Prayer. All are welcome to join, using the booklets at the back of church. Please remember to be reverent when Our Lord is exposed on the altar and not to disrespect Him.

After the Mass, please join us for refreshments at the back of church.

Children & families

Children and families are very welcome here: our Sunday School meets at the back of Church and there is also a 'Children's Chapel' space with books and toys in the South Aisle, for young children and their parents to use at any point during Mass. Toilets are available at the back of church and in the crypt, accessed via the stairs at the end of the South Aisle.

During the Mass - 'Talk to God before Mass, and each other afterwards!'

Please follow the directions to *sit*, *stand or kneel in italics* and join with the words in bold. Please remember that people are trying to pray before Mass, so keep silence as much as possible and don't disturb those at prayer. Please also remember that the time after receiving Holy Communion is for prayer and contemplation – <u>not to have conversations</u>.

Holy Communion

At the Giving of Holy Communion, if you are confirmed and wish to receive the Sacrament, please come forward to receive Communion via the main aisle following the directions of the sidesmen.

<u>Everyone</u> is very welcome to come forward for a blessing: if you would like one, please bow your head.

Holy Communion is offered at the communion rail in both forms. Please kneel, unless you are unable. The Host is received on the tongue, (or if preferred on the hands). If you wish to receive from the Chalice, please assist the Eucharistic Ministers by guiding the Chalice towards your lips and not bowing your head forward.


The Greeting

In the name of the Father ★ and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

The Lord be with you.



The Priest introduces the Mass, and the children of the parish come forward to receive their bible and blessing, and the items to prepare their altar.

The Mass then continues with **The Penitential Rite** as the Priest invites us to prepare to confess to God with the Collect for purity:

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen

The Priest invites us to consider our sins in silence, before we confess them to the Lord saying: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against thee and against our neighbour, in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are heartily sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of thy Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve thee in newness of life to the glory of thy name. Amen.

The Priest pronounces the absolution:

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, ▶ pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

The Choir lead The Gloria

- 1. Glory be to God in heaven, peace to those who love him well; on the earth let all his people speak his grace, his wonders tell: Lord, we praise you for your glory, mighty Father, heaven's king; hear our joyful adoration and accept the thanks we bring.
- 2. Only Son of God the Father, Lamb who takes our sin away, now with God in triumph seated for your mercy, Lord, we pray: Jesus Christ, most high and holy, Saviour, you are God alone in the glory of the Father with the Spirit: Three-in-One!

The Priest sings the Collect:

Almighty ever-living God, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of the universe, grant, we pray, that the whole creation, set free from slavery, may render your majesty service and ceaselessly proclaim your praise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Amen.

First Reading A reading from the Second Book of Samuel The word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**

Psalm 46 – R/ The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold

- 1 God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble;
- 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, and though the mountains tremble in the heart of the sea;
- 3 Though the waters rage and swell, and though the mountains quake at the towering seas.
- 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy place of the dwelling of the Most High.
- 5 God is in the midst of her; therefore shall she not be removed; God shall help her at the break of day.

- 6 The nations are in uproar and the kingdoms are shaken, but God utters his voice and the earth shall melt away.
- 7 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.
- 8 Come and behold the works of the Lord, what destruction he has wrought upon the earth.
- 9 He makes wars to cease in all the world; he shatters the bow and snaps the spear and burns the chariots in the fire.
- 10 'Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth.'
- 11 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

Second Reading A reading from the Letter to the Colossians The word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**

<u>Please stand</u> for the Gospel Acclamation.

The Gospel of the Lord

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

<u>Please sit</u> for the Homily - The homily is followed by a time of silent reflection.

The Creed – *please stand*.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (all bow)

was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

<u>Please remain standing</u> for the **Intercessions**

After each petition: Lord, in your mercy **Hear our prayer.**As we pray for the dead: Rest eternal, grant unto them O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them.

After the final petition we entrust all our prayer and petitions to the unceasing prayers of the Saints in heaven, especially to the Blessed Virgin Mary who we greet saying: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

The Priest concludes the prayer, and all respond: Amen

The Peace

The Priest introduces the peace, then shares it with the people

The peace of the Lord be always with you **And also with you.** Let us offer one another a sign of peace *All share a sign of peace with those near them*

<u>Please then sit</u> for the offertory hymn as bread and wine are brought forward for the preparation of the altar.

<u>Please stand</u> when the congregation is censed by the thurifer.

Offertory Hymn

- 1. Rejoice, the Lord is King, Your Lord and King adore; Mortals, give thanks and sing, And triumph evermore: Lift up your heart, lift up your voice; Rejoice, again I say, rejoice.

The Priest offers the Prayer over the Gifts, and all respond. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you

Lift up your hearts

We lift them up to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

It is right to give Him thanks and praise

The Priest continues with the Opening (Preface) of the Prayer of Thanksgiving at the end of which the choir leads the **Sanctus**



<u>Please kneel</u> as the Priest continues the Prayer of Thanksgiving.

He first invokes the Holy Spirit to sanctify the offerings of bread and wine. He then recalls the Lord's actions the night before he died. A bell is rung as the Priest elevates the consecrated Host and Chalice.

He then says:

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Priest continues with the Eucharistic Prayer.



The Lord's Prayer

Please remain kneeling as all pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

As the Priest breaks the bread, he says: We break this bread, to share in the Body of Christ **Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.**



Giving of Communion

<u>Please remain kneeling</u> as the Priest shows the Body of Christ

Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof,
but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Before coming forward to receive Holy Communion, all pray together:

We do not presume to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table. But thou art the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

As the Priest receives Holy Communion, a bell is rung & the people begin to come forward. If you are confirmed and wish to receive Holy Communion, please come forward via the main aisle, following the directions of the stewards.

All are welcome to come forward for a blessing: if you would like one, please bow your head.

Holy Communion is offered in both forms at the Communion Rail. Please kneel, unless you are unable. The Host is received on the tongue (or, if preferred, on the hands.) If you wish to receive from the Chalice, please assist the Eucharistic Ministers by guiding the Chalice towards your lips and not bowing your head forward. If you don't wish to receive from the Chalice, you can return to your seat after receiving the Host.

Intinction (dipping the Host in the Chalice) is not permitted.

During the receiving of Holy Communion, the Choir sing an **Anthem Motet:** Lift up your heads, O ye gates - Matthias

All then join in the Communion Hymn

- 1. Christ is the King, O friends rejoice!
 Brothers and sisters, with one voice
 Make all men know he is your choice: Alleluya.
- 2. The first Apostles round them drew
 Thousands of faithful men and true,
 Sharing a faith for ever new:
 Alleluya.
- 3. Then magnify the Lord and raise
 Anthems of joy and holy praise
 For Christ's brave saints of ancient days: Alleluya.

- 4. O Christian women,
 Christian men,
 All the world over, seek again
 The Way disciples followed then:
 Alleluya.
- 5. Christ through all ages is the same;
 Place the same hope in his great name,
 With the same faith his word proclaim: Alleluya.
- 6. Let Love's unconquerable might
 God's people everywhere unite
 In service to the Lord of light:
 Alleluya.

As the Sacred Vessels are cleansed in the Lady Chapel, the Priest & servers lead the people in the **Prayer of Thanksgiving after Holy Communion**

Almighty God, we thank thee for feeding us with the body and blood of thy Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer thee our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of thy Spirit to live and work to thy praise and glory. Amen.

The Priest & servers then return to the Sanctuary for a time of silent prayer.

Please stand for the Priest to sing the Prayer after Communion

Having received the food of immortality, we ask, O Lord, that, glorying in obedience to the commands of Christ, the King of the universe, we may live with him eternally in his heavenly kingdom. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Please stand for The Blessing and Dismissal

As the Sanctuary party prepares to depart, all sing the Recessional Hymn

As the procession approaches the Image of Our Lady, <u>all turn</u> to focus on the Blessed Virgin as the Priest leads the singing of **the Angelus**
